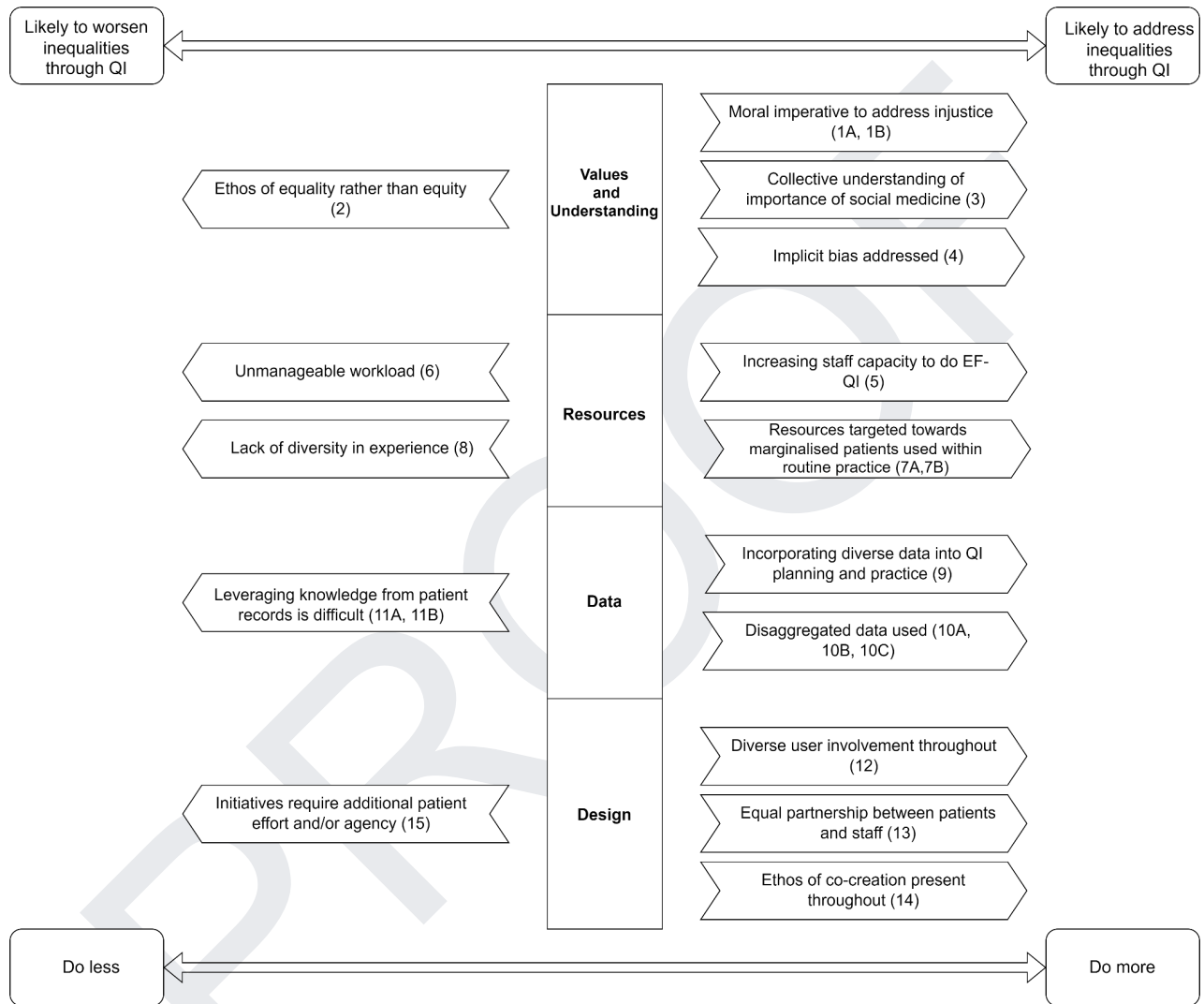


Working Programme Theory Diagram
